From the Pastor.

As I write this, I have just returned from vacation.

As some of you know, this was a working for vacation, of sorts, for me. Mary and I returned to the Pennsylvania community where I served my internship and then my first call. The main reason for our return to Somerset County was for me to officiate at the wedding of a young woman whose family we had been very close to in my first call and continue to remain close. In fact, the bride was born just hours before our son, Nathan. I was asked to officiate because the congregation the family belongs to, Mt. Calvary, one of the congregations from my first call, does not currently have a pastor. And, since they don't currently have a pastor, I volunteered to also do pulpit supply on Sunday morning.

Now, over the last few years, the situation for several churches in that area has changed. The congregation that Mt. Calvary had been yoked with in the parish I served has left the ELCA. Another congregation in the area, St. Luke's, has closed. And so, Mt. Calvary is now sharing ministry with the neighboring three-point parish where I did my internship along with some of the folks who had been members of the closed congregation.

The point of all this is to say that on Sunday morning, I led worship in two buildings from my internship (at 8:30 am and 10:30 am) with people from five different congregations. Many of those folks were people I ministered to and with when I was in Somerset County nearly 40 years ago.

Here's the part that caught me off guard, though. Over the course of Sunday morning, I connected with people as if I had never left. Certainly, we had changed physically. But we seemed to pick up the relationship right where we had left off.

For example, one woman, who was a member of St. Luke's, came to the 8:30 am worship wearing a Pittsburgh Pirate t-shirt. She did it intentionally to goad me, remembering the cluster bus trips we took to Pirate games (for some reason always against the Cubs) in which the Pirates always won.

It all felt to me like I was returning to family. These were people who, 40 years ago, we shared in ministry. But we also developed life-long relationships. We worked together, we laughed together, we struggled together, we mourned together. They were then, and continue to be now, family.

That, I believe, is what being a part of the body of Christ is all about. We are family. We live and work together through all the trials and tribulations of life and ministry. And through it all, we develop life long, caring relationships. It is in these relationships that I most easily find the presence of Christ in my life.

And that experience has been the same for me everywhere I have served, including with you, the people of Calvary and St. James. I am confident that the relationships we have created will continue to endure through all the years that are to come.

And so, I am tremendously grateful for all the people I have had the honor to serve with throughout my career. You are family to me. And with you, we are the family of God.


CALVARY'S BLOOD DRIVE
