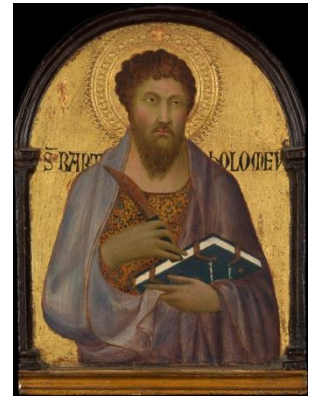

From the Pastor

As I work on this letter, we are just a couple days from the Feast Day of Saint Bartholomew.

So, you may now be asking, “So what?” And that, I suppose, is a legitimate question. The only reason I know that August 24 is the day in the church year that we commemorate St. Bartholomew is because the calendar I download every year from Augsburg Fortress includes all the commemorations and I happened to notice the mention of Bartholomew on August 24.

Curious, I decided to educate myself about this Christian saint. Who was he and why do we remember him? Here’s what I learned... Bartholomew is mentioned in the list of Jesus apostles in Matthew (10:3), Mark (3:18), Luke (6:14) and Acts (1:3). That’s it. Now you know everything there is to know about St. Bartholomew. (Well, that’s not entirely true. We can also say with a fair amount of certainty that his father’s name was Tolmai, or some variant spelling of that, because Bartholomew literally means “Son of Tolmai.”)



Beyond being listed in the New Testament as an apostle, there are a few things that various traditions have attributed to Saint Bartholomew. Some suggest that he is the same person that John refers to as Nathanael in his list of apostles. Other traditions suggest that following the resurrection he brought the faith to Ethiopia, Mesopotamia, Parthia (modern Iraq) Lyconia (modern Turkey), and Armenia. He is said to have been martyred by flaying and (according to one source I read) is thus the patron saint of tanners.

Now, with this information in hand, you may very well still be asking, “So what?” Why should we have a day dedicated to someone we know almost nothing about?

If for no other reason, that he was one of Jesus’ closest companions during his ministry makes Bartholomew worthy of recognition.

However, as one meditation I read in reflecting on Bartholomew suggests, perhaps it is noteworthy that we really don’t know anything else for sure about him. We know he was a follower of Jesus, but a relatively anonymous one. And yet it is on the foundation of relatively anonymous people like Bartholomew that the church has been built and the Christian faith has been spread. The vast majority of us have come to faith, not because someone famous taught us, but because someone who will, in the history of Christianity be virtually anonymous, shared the gospel with us.

So, it is right and good that we take a moment and thank St. Bartholomew and all the other relatively anonymous evangelists for their role in sharing the good news of Jesus Christ throughout the generations.

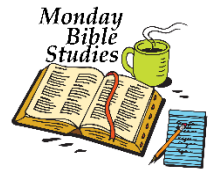


KNIT – A- BIT
