From the Pastor,

³⁶As [Jesus] rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷As he was now approaching the path down from the Mount of Olives, the whole multitude of the disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice for all the deeds of power that they had seen, ³⁸saying,

"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, and glory in the highest heaven!"

³⁹Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, order your disciples to stop." ⁴⁰He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out." (Luke 19: 36-40)

Over the last five years or so I've often thought about this passage. Almost daily during the Covid-19 years, I would hear people complain that because congregations weren't gathering in person, the church was going to die. Since the Covid restrictions have ended, I continue to hear people bemoaning the death of the church because of a lack of new members, or a lack of young families, or financial shortfalls, or any number of reasons. And when I hear these dire prognostications, I think about Jesus' retort to the Pharisees, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

Yes, the church may very well look different in the future. As members of St. James and Calvary are aware, the days of one pastor serving one congregation are waning. Worship attendance is smaller. Finances are tighter. Likewise, there may not be a Sunday School or confirmation classes because parents of younger children may not find the institution of the church important or being a part of

a worshiping community a priority. There are all kinds of things that seem to be threatening the existence of congregations.

But that does not mean that the Word of God will be silenced. The gospel will be proclaimed, even if God must raise up stones to shout it out.

I believe that people of Calvary and St. James are a shining example of the gospel not being silenced.

- Despite the challenges that each congregation faces, we continue to worship faithfully and see some growth in the number of people worshiping with us.
- Though they may not be young families, each congregation has received new members in the past year.
- We continue to provide love and support for our members in all of life's ups and downs.
- We share the love of God in tangible ways through meals for those who suffer food insecurity or may be homeless.
- Quilts, lap robes, hats, mittens and school kits have been shared with shut-ins, nursing home residents, the homeless, and those in need both locally and around the world.
- We've given a hand up to those who find adequate housing a challenge in our support of Habitat for Humanity.
- We've served our community by picking up litter.
- Through synod mission support we've supported the creation of new congregations, helped develop new leaders for the church, worked to fight injustice and share the gospel throughout the country and around the world.
- With special gifts we have sought to alleviate the suffering of our brothers and sisters around the globe when disaster has struck.
- And the list goes on.

Indeed, even though it may seem like the forces of the world are eroding the mission of the church, the work of our congregations are a sure sign that the gospel will not and cannot be silenced.

I have no doubt that into the next generation our congregations will look different. But I am also confident, while we may not look the same, the word and work of God will continue through us in whatever form our institution may take. God will not be silenced, even if God must raise up stones to shout it out.

Thank you for being a part of God's mission and God's voice through St. James and Calvary.

Good advice from our Parish Nurse, Becki Maxson:

GOOD POSTURE

Good posture helps your heart fill easier; your lungs expand better and helps blood flow to our brains more efficiently. 2-3 times a day stand with your heels, bottom, shoulders and head pressed against a wall for 30 seconds. This will remind you how it feels to stand upright and help your body recognize good posture. Hold your cell phone at eye level when texting, adjust your computer so you are not looking

down and at the grocery store don't lean over on the cart, stand upright. (your mother would be proud of your good posture!)

PROTECT YOURSELF

It is always acceptable to wear a mask to protect yourself and others, especially when you are in a crowded situation. It's not too late to get the latest COVID booster, RSV vaccine or Flu shot if you haven't already done so. Studies show that over the counter Vitamin C and Zinc can help boost your immune system (look it up and check with your doctor).
