From the Pastor:

I write this letter from Gettysburg, Pennsylvania where I am participating in a continuing education event. As most of you are well aware, Mary and I are frequent visitors to Gettysburg. We came to appreciate the place while I attended seminary here. As you can well imagine, Gettysburg has changed over the last 37 years since I graduated from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg. Some of our favorite sites remain the same. And there have been some improvements as the movement to restore much of the battlefield to the way it was in 1863 has progressed.

One change, however, that is not for the better, is the prevalence of "Ghost Tours." I know that they have become popular in tourist towns all over. We see them offered, for instance, when we visit Galena, Illinois. But personally, I find the ghost tours here in Gettysburg offensive. I suppose I think promoting the loss of life that took place here in some commercial "paranormal" enterprise is disrespectful of the people who suffered here during the first three days of July, 1863.

That being said, I have a framed art print in my study at home entitled "Days of Glory" by Lloyd Garrison. The painting depicts two very old Civil War veterans at the "High Water Mark" in Gettysburg. (I won't take the time to explain the significance of the site here. If you want to know more, just ask me.) I imagine they are there for perhaps the 50th anniversary of the battle. Surrounding them are what I would describe as "shadows" of the soldiers who fought alongside them on July 3, 1863. They are not ghosts, but more like the memories of those men.

And I will admit that as I have wandered the Gettysburg battlefield over the last 37 years, I, too, have had a sense of the people who lived and died in these streets, fields, homes and buildings (including one in the middle of the seminary campus). They are not ghosts, but they are the presence of the people who fought for the preservation of the union, the ones who "gave the last full measure of devotion" (from Lincoln's Gettysburg Address). Their presence is somehow still with us a reminder of their sacrifice that shaped who we are and what we have today.

I get that same sense in the quiet moments I have when I'm in our sanctuaries. As I sit in the pews in what most observers would see as an empty sanctuary, I get the distinct impression that I'm not alone. I sense the presence of those in the faith who have gone before me. I feel the presence of my teachers and mentors. I feel the presence of those who physically labored to raise funds for the building if not physically raise the building itself. I feel the presence of Sunday School teachers and confirmation instructors, of pastors and choir members and musicians and worship leaders and youth group leaders. I feel the presence of those who in their own way gave the last full measure of devotion in order for us to gather together in worship and service of our Lord. We are indeed surrounded by, not ghosts, but by what Paul refers to as a great cloud of witnesses.

I am always thankful for that unexplainable but very real presence of those saints who came before us and laid the foundation of faith for us, who helped to shape us into who we are today. We may not see them, but I know they are here.


from Betty Clark: Thank you to my friends at Calvary for all the beautiful cards and flowers. I miss you all. Your thoughtfulness warmed my heart.
