From the Pastor,

By the time I entered seminary in the fall of 1983 I was a young (23 years-old), confident (cocky?) Christian. I had been very active in worship and church-life since I was 14. I graduated from college with a major in religion. I had been leading Bible studies at camp for several years. I figured I knew it all.

I'm not sure how many class sessions into my seminary career I had attended (but I could have counted them on one hand) before so much of what I thought I knew had been challenged. It was like I had been knocked upside my head. I came to understand the Holy Spirit had opened my eyes to new and exciting understandings of God and the way I saw God working in the world.

And that was not the last time the Holy Spirit knocked me upside the head. So often throughout my ministry, at times when I was confident with how I understood God and what God wanted me to do, the Holy Spirit did some "course correcting."

Perhaps the most gut-wrenching example came about 25 years ago. I had been approached by an adult visitor to the congregation about being baptized. We set up a time to talk. Then, during the course of the worship, he came to the altar rail to receive communion. Well, I had always understood, based on scripture and church teachings, that baptism was a prerequisite to participation in holy communion. So, with his hand out at the rail to receive the bread, I whispered to him that he had to baptized first. I denied him communion.

In following what I believed to be God's rules I had thrown a stumbling block in front of new believer. He, in fact, never returned to church and I wouldn't be surprised if he never attended any other church, anywhere, ever. And for no good reason. Communion is a meal that draws us into and makes us a part of the *one* body of Christ. Yet what I had done excluded him. I felt sick, like I'd been punched in the gut.

In the time that followed, I came to believe that it was the Spirit that punched me in the gut, and then opened my eyes to the reality that Holy Communion is an offering from God for all people. God can be gracious to whomever God chooses, whether they are baptized or not.

Since those early seminary days and throughout my ministry I have tried to be open to the leading of the Spirit. I don't always know everything. (In fact, the longer I'm in ministry the more I realize how much I don't know.) And regularly the Holy Spirit opens my eyes (or punches me in the gut) to see things in a completely different way.

My encouragement to you, then, is to always keep your hearts and minds open to the leading of the Spirit. God is not done with us yet, and we always have more to learn.

"The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." (John 3:8)
