### From the Pastor,

<sup>18</sup> Then [the crowd] all shouted out together, "Away with this fellow! Release Barabbas for us!"<sup>19</sup> (This was a man who had been put in prison for an insurrection that had taken place in the city, and for murder.) <sup>20</sup> Pilate, wanting to release Jesus, addressed them again; <sup>21</sup> but they kept shouting, "Crucify, crucify him!"<sup>22</sup> A third time he said to them, "Why, what evil has he done? I have found in him no ground for the sentence of death; I will therefore have him flogged and then release him."<sup>23</sup> But they kept urgently demanding with loud shouts that he should be crucified; and their voices prevailed.<sup>24</sup> So Pilate gave his verdict that their demand should be granted.<sup>25</sup> He released the man they asked for, the one who had been put in prison for insurrection and murder, and he handed Jesus over as they wished. (Luke 23:18-25)

As a student at Augustana, I took a literature class entitled, "Images of the Divine." Among the books we read was the novel, *Barabbas*, by Swedish Nobel Prize-winning author Pär Lagerkvist. The book tells the fictional story of Barabbas after the crucifixion of Jesus. In my memory of the story (which is not necessarily supported by some of the reviews I've just looked up), Lagerkvist reflects on Barabbas as a man tormented by the knowledge that he, a guilty man, is alive because an innocent man, Jesus, has been crucified.

That juxtaposition of being undeservedly alive because someone else is dead, in some ways, haunted me as I read the novel. The guilt and the shame made so much sense to me. I could only imagine the anguish one would feel to know that someone had been intentionally executed in my place. That, though, I think is exactly the perspective that those who shared the story of Jesus' passion (like the version from Luke above) want their readers to understand. Unfortunately, we often overlook or downplay that perspective.

In truth, we are all Barabbas. All of us are guilty, I would suggest, of insurrection. All of us are guilty of fighting against God in one way or another. We all have failed to live according to God's expectations. We all have denied, at one time or another, that God is in charge as we sought to do things our way. We are all Barabbas.

And for us, people who are guilty of rebelling against God, Jesus died. Jesus, the innocent one died in our place so that we may live.

Now, I don't believe that Jesus' intent here would be for us to live lives tormented by guilt as the character from the Lagerkvist novel did. Rather, Jesus wants us to live lives that honor his sacrifice for us. Jesus wants to live lives that reflect the compassion and love that he modeled for us in his crucifixion.

Jesus did indeed die for us as he did for Barabbas. Now we are called on to make the most of this gift of life through loving service to others.
