From the Pastor:

Last summer one of our vacation trips involved renting a cabin on a lake near Hayward, WI. This trip was an experiment, in that Mary and I decided to include our children and 2½ year-old grandson – all together in the same cabin for a week. And, to my surprise, not only did we all survive, but it was a good experience.

Part of what helped me endure the relatively constant hubbub of five adults and one very active toddler in one place was the birds. The owner of the cabin had lined the railing of the deck, which overlooked the woods between the cabin and the lake, with birdfeeders. Mary and I spent a lot of time sitting quietly on the deck watching the constant arrival and departure of finches and sparrows and woodpeckers (along with a handful of small ground squirrels and chipmunks) at the various feeders. For us, it was tranquilly therapeutic. As I sat there, I felt a sense of peace and calm amidst a chaotic world.

We have since added several birdfeeders to our own yard. And I find myself, daily, spending time staring out the window at the finches and sparrows and woodpeckers (and a couple persistent squirrels) that make their way to the birdfeeders. And not surprisingly, as I take those momentary breaks from working at the computer or doing laundry or cooking or other household chores, that same sense of peace and calm settles over me.

I share this story with you not because it serves as an analogy for some deep theological or religious message. I share the story with you as a suggestion. Perhaps you may want to take up birdwatching (or something similar) as a way to take a moment or two away from the chaos that is so often a part of our daily lives to find a little serenity.

After all, Jesus invites us in Matthew 6 to,

²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷ Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' ³² For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things.



REGARDING ELEVATOR

The council has put on hold the plan to replace our current elevator. At the annual meeting, the congregation approved spending up to about \$46,000 for the project based on a proposal from Nu-Trend. Unfortunately, at that time the council did not understand that the congregation would be responsible for preparing the current elevator shaft for the new lift. After consulting with Nu-Trend and contractors, it appears that the unanticipated preparation work would cost between \$60,000 to \$80,000. The council believes this additional cost makes the project untenable for Calvary at this time. The council will be exploring other options for accessibility in order to be prepared in the event the current elevator fails.
