From the Pastor,

Oh, God! Why me?

Most of us have uttered, or at least thought, that plea at some point. Something has gone wrong in our lives. Or maybe something just hasn't gone the way we believed it should. And so, out of a sense of some perceived injustice in our lives, "Why, God," we wonder, "has this thing happened (or not happened) to me that I certainly don't deserve."

One of the most memorable devotions I ever heard began with that emphatic plea. Oh, God! Why me?

However, in the case of this particular devotion, the leader turned this phrase upside-down. She invited us to ask the question, "Oh, God! She encouraged us to look at the blessings of our lives and recognize them as gifts from a loving God who showers us with good gifts even though we may not deserve them, sinners that we are.

- Oh, God! Why have you given me your love, mercy, and forgiveness?
- Oh, God! Why have you given me the gift of life now and through death to eternity in your kingdom?

These are just a few of the blessings I have been given to which I might utter, "Oh, God! Why me?"

In this month in which we celebrate Thanksgiving, I invite you to generate your own list of blessings in response to the plea, "Oh, God! Why me?" Let this be a season in which we open our eyes and our hearts to recognize all the good that is around us and comes to us.
